MANAGER'S REPORT

Our London cup tie on Sunday was against Bromley Knights who are currently top of the Premier Division of their league in South-East London/Kent with a 100% record. We were missing goalkeeper Simon Jackson and the suspended Daniel Daley but we were grateful to Martin Loveday for making himself available to go in goal despite having to go to a wedding in the afternoon and Terry Moore returned from injury to make the substitutes' bench. Frankie Karemo was late once again and lost his place in the starting eleven as a result. Ben Keating had been unfortunate to lose his place due to his recent unavailability because of transport difficulties so he was keen to start. As we feared our opponents would be a strong team we played a defensive 4-4-2 system. Some of our spectators were getting frustrated and calling for us to push forward more but all credit to the team for following my pre match instructions and we were happy with 0-0 at half time. There were chances at both ends but the defences were on top. Alan Barnard had got injured after 30 minutes but with Terry Moore able to replace him we were still solid in defence. The second half was a similar pattern of play until we took the lead after 73 minutes when Rafiel Johnson was quickest to finish from a loose ball in the area. We had chances to extend the lead and no major scares at the back. The biggest danger was the potential of extra time as several of our players looked shattered and Tony King would have to have gone in goal with Loveday having to leave. Fortunately, the game finished 1-0 and we now have an away trip to South London in November against Dees Reserves to look forward to.
