Report: With Division 4 side Churchbury not having won a match in any competition for 19 months (and turning up with only 10 men!), we were never in any real danger of losing this fixture and it was always a question of just how many goals we would get. However, we struggled to find our rhythm early on in the match, mainly because too many of our players were 'dripping with jewellery', causing referee Steve Wildgoose to keep stopping the match for them to remove these 'items' or get them taped up (as per FIFA Rules). In fact Churchbury even managed to equalise through a dubiously-awarded penalty before John Beasley regained the lead for us, but thereafter it was a story of non-stop wasted chances (apart from the in-form Derek Dorward) and one or two players having a bit of an off-day defensively which could have allowed Churchbury further consolation goals. At least in our build-up play we managed to pass and control the ball as well as in any match so far this season though and that was the main reason we progressed comfortably through to the next round.
