## **MATCH REPORT**

Although we had won four matches in a row coming into this fixture, we knew this game was going to be a lot harder than any of those previous victories as Hornsey & Highgate had beaten us twice in Division One last season...and with only 10 men all match in one of those games. On both occasions they outmuscled and bullied our players, so we were determined not to let that happen again and the first 15 minutes were played at a frantic pace as we competed for every ball and made it a midfield battle with no shots at goal from either side. However, Lexton Harrison then made a terrible mistake (having turned up late and not warmed up properly) when he let the ball bounce under his foot from a drop-kick by Hornsey & Highgate keeper Ant Manoli, resulting in Curtis Baalam having to make a desperate last-ditch 'man & ball challenge' to put Sam Fowler off his eventual shot. Referee James Smith saw that as a penalty though, which their lone striker Sam Keenan easily despatched to put his side 1-0 up. It then got worse for us just four minutes later when Harrison and his fellow central defender Richard Harris both got out-muscled by Keenan, who flicked the ball on for Michael Hamilton to lose his marker Aiden Kavanagh and easily lob over the stranded Ian Whitmore to make it 2-0. It didn't help that we were without defenders Sam Woolley, Tyronne Petrie & Troy Blake for this match, as another mistake at the back cost us a third goal after just 24 minutes when Oshade Watson was beaten to a loose ball and then out-battled in the subsequent scramble that led to Sam Fowler getting in a low shot that squirmed its way in past defender Harris and keeper Whitmore. Although we had been unlucky to find ourselves 3-0 down from the only three chances created by either side at that stage of the match and we then started creating chances of our own towards the end of the First Half, Manager Tony McKay was furious at Half-Time and demanded we show more bottle and fight in the Second Half. That worked to some extent as we certainly played a lot better, with Nasser Ali's spectacular curling shot into the top corner in the  $52^{nd}$  minute making it 3-1 to give us a lifeline, but our second goal in the 81st minute from a Jack Bangs penalty after a handball in the area came too late in the game really, and although we still created several half-chances in the last 21 minutes (which included 12 minutes of 'added-on time' by the Referee for injuries and time-wasting), Hornsey & Highgate had a number of chances in the Second Half as well that were more clear-cut, and they proved to be a much better side than our last four opponents, managing to see out the win with us not having enough attacking options on the bench to come on and find an equaliser.
