#### MANAGER'S REPORT

Although we had several players unavailable at least all 14 in the squad attended in good time on Sunday morning. It was our opponents in the London Cup, Kensington Athletic, who had a long journey across London by train and bus with five players not turning up leaving them with a bare eleven and us with a late kick off. We dominated possession right from the kick off and several chances were missed before a dubious penalty was awarded after a trip on Danny Hagan. Captain Stuart Dorward easily converted from the spot but that was to be our only goal before half time. Our opponents had their regular centre half in goal, a couple of players carrying injuries and several others just well below the standard of opposition we are used to in our league. After urging our players to take their chances Stuart Dorward scored his second with a header from a free kick just 39 seconds into the second half and a minute later Tony King scored with a low shot to make the game safe. We were able to relax and play good football for the rest of the game but did not score again until Terry Brown rounded the keeper in the 79<sup>th</sup> minute. Dean Assiamah rolled the ball into an empty net as Kensington stopped for an injury to Lee King whilst the referee was telling us to play on. It could have been controversial if the scoreline was closer but we were right to play to the whistle. Olie Tedder and Darryl Johnson came on for the last 10 minutes and we scored twice more through Terry Moore and Lexton Harrison to make the final score 7-0. We have now stretched our unbeaten run to four matches and we are gaining in confidence through having a more settled side.
